(Sheriff's Commissioner's Inmate Labor Detail)

The Bannock County Sheriff's Commissioner's Inmate Labor Detail Program (SCILD) was implemented on June 1, 1993 by the Bannock County Sheriff's Office, County Commissioners and the Bannock County Court. Since the program was implemented we feel that it has been a great success and a valuable asset as it continues to improve and grow. Listed below are just a few of the topics we feel are important to make note of.

Benefits of having the SCILD Program:

1. Minimum classified inmates, driving crimes, fines, etc. are allowed to "work off" their sentence and/or fines on the days that they can schedule; hence, allowing them to be home at night, work around their job, schooling, substance abuse programs, court, household and other obligations they may have. This also opens up several beds in the jail.
2. The same minimum classified inmates that are "confined" in the jail are also allowed to work SCILD if they meet the following criteria listed below. This allows them to relieve some of their tension by getting out of the jail daily and they seem to feel better about themselves. They also are inclined to follow the rules because they do not want to jeopardize losing their SCILD status. They are often times given 2 for 1's by their sentencing Judge, which allows them to only serve half of their original sentence, which in turn is a better utilization of county jail inmate beds
 - a. Must be approved by their Judge(s).
 - b. Must not have any major medical problems that would prohibit them from performing strenuous work. If the inmate has epilepsy, seizures or are in the first terms of a pregnancy they MUST have a written release from their doctor prior to them being allowed to work SCILD.
 - c. Must not be a sex offender.
 - d. Must not have committed a violent crime.
 - e. Must not have any major disciplinary problems.
 - f. Must not be an escape risk or have prior escapes on their criminal history.
 - g. Must be sentenced on all charges currently incarcerated on.
 - h. Must have paid any past due SCILD fees.

minimum wage and the hours of labor provided to each entity by the inmates. Ultimately this is a huge cost savings to the tax payers.

Here is some general information about the SCILD Program for those that have been ordered by their Judge to complete SCILD time:

You must check in at the SCILD Office by 7:45 a.m. and will work until 4:00 p.m. Please realize that you may not be accepted to work the program due to medical reasons, past disciplinary problems and/or charges. If you are late you will not be able to participate and will be counted as a no show. You are allowed two no shows and/or reschedules. After that your Judge is notified and you may be ordered to serve your remaining time in jail. Dress according to weather. You **MAY NOT** wear shorts, tank tops, sleeveless shirts or open toed shoes. Do not bring cell phones, any music playing devices nor any sharp objects. A lunch will be provided. You will be charged \$3.00 per day (to be paid in full on or prior to the last day worked).
