<p>Legislative Council's Statement of Meaning, Purpose, and Results to Be Accomplished</p>		<p>The purpose of the bonds is to provide for the construction of a new fire station, which may provide space for other city functions, and allow the existing city offices to be converted to a senior/community center. The City currently has outstanding indebtedness of \$678,718, payable from sewer system revenues and outstanding indebtedness of \$268,061, payable from water system revenues. The anticipated interest rate on the proposed bonds is 1.5% per annum. The total proposed principal amount to be repaid over the 30-year life of the bonds is \$1,125,000; the total interest anticipated to be paid over the life of the bonds is \$280,323; the total amount to be repaid over the life of the bonds is \$1,405,323.</p>
<p>The purpose of the proposed amendment is to permanently set the number of senators in the Idaho Legislature, as well as the number of legislative districts in Idaho, at 35. (There are twice as many representatives as senators, which this amendment would not change.) Since 1992, there have been 35 districts and senators, but the Idaho Constitution permits as few as 30 and as many as 35 districts and senators, with the number determined during redistricting (the process of redrawing legislative district boundaries after a United States census). If this amendment is adopted, the number of districts and senators would be fixed at 35 and could not be changed during redistricting.</p>		<p>The estimated average annual cost to the taxpayer on the proposed bond levy is a tax of \$72.96 per \$100,000 of taxable assessed value, per year, based on current conditions.</p>
